Specific Details:

Wood boards covered with embossed leather, still largely intact, with male clasps still extant.

Number given on additional matter 3b is Api0. 36. 1a of text has Api0. 91.

This MS has some of the most extensive and comprehensive headings and hypotheses of any NT MS extant. An important witness to the Euthalian apparatus.

Neumes and lectionary equipment are seen throughout the codex.

- 1a: The beginning of the codex appears to still be extant, for 1a begins with εκθεσις κεφαλαιων των πραξεων των αγιων αποστολων in rubricated majuscule letters.
- 1a-6a: full κεφάλαια for Acts
- 6b–14a: "hypothesis for the book of Acts" broken down into subdivisions
- 14b–16b: Ανακεφαλαιωσις θειων μαρτυριων της βιβλου των πραξεων λουκα[ς] του ευαγγελ.

17a-88a: Acts

- 17a: very elaborate and colorful headpiece for the beginning of Acts
- 88b–89b: Prologue to the Catholic Epistles; $\sigma\tau_{1\chi}$ (yet the numbers don't add up)
- 89b–90a: κεφαλαια for James; στιχοι κε (same problem with the count)
- 90b: hypothesis for James
- 91a–97b: James
- 91a: semi-elaborate headpiece for James
- 93a: marginal note with arrow pointing to it; note uses many abbreviations 97b: end of James, $\sigma \tau_{12} \sigma_{12} (=246)$,² hypothesis for 1 Peter begins

² There are c. 286 lines for James, but the $\sigma\tau_{1\chi_{01}}$ come to 246. Perhaps these books, by this time, had a fixed number of lines that were considered for wages. See the $\sigma\tau_{1\chi_{01}}$ figures for the prologue for the CE and the headings for James.

³ 14 pages for 1 Peter x 22 lines per page = 308 (less 7 for short last page) = 301 lines. But the scribe is only charging for 208 lines. The number of lines for each book of the NT were apparently fixed, as far as wages were concerned, by this time. But the discrepancy between James and 1 Peter in terms of length does not seem to be explained on this basis. Regardless of how many lines were to be charged, one book would be considered longer than the other and the proportions should be the same even if the lines varied from century to century. *Accordance* lists the number of words in James (MT) as 1763, and 1 Peter as 1720. Why are there more lines for 1 Peter in this MS than for James?

⁴ For James and Acts the κεφάλαια preceded the books, but for 1 Peter they follow. Did the scribe simply forget about them when he began writing out 1 Peter? If so, he also forgot them for 2 Peter!
