Front cover: 0 additional leaves + cover b = 1 images Back cover: 0 additional leaves + cover a = 1 images

Specific Details:

Red velvet over wood cover, still largely intact.

1a: Looks like a note of ownership, dated 1803.

2a: introductory material to lectionary; different hand from rest of manuscript.

3a: Prologue of John, the beginning of the lectionary proper.

156b: lectionary concludes with the dominical aphorism, "many [who are] first shall be last, and the last first" (πολλοι δε εσονται πρωτοι εσχατοι και εσχατοι πρωτοι:— [Matt 19.30]). Slightly later hand wrote a note at end of lectionary: ζωὴν αἰώνιον κληρονομήσει ("he will inherit eternal life").
